Nunda Comprehensive Plan

Chairperson Pierce presented the newly completed Joint Town/Village Comprehensive Plan. He mentioned that this was a living document and that future iterations would include more student-based images and data.

2026-2027 Budget

Superintendent Powers and Business Official Forrester spoke at length about the KSD budget. The Keshequa School District proposed budget amount will be \$21,998,837.00. The tax levy increase this year is projected to be 1%. There is money in the budget again this year to provide all students with their necessary school supplies. Declining enrollment continues. There are no plans to purchase electric buses. Hybrid vehicles are being considered. There was a discussion on the recent property assessment revaluation.

Superintendent Powers reported that the School's attorney had drafted Intermunicipal Cooperative Agreements for storing the School's salt supply at the Town's salt shed and also for the Town and Village to utilize the School's established communication system. Mayor Morgan reported that the Town and Village had explored, and opted into, a separate communication system. Superintendent Powers mentioned that the communication agreement could be revised to allow the Town and Village to use the School District's new lighted sign on Mill Street.
